








Tena Koutou, e hoa ma. Nga mihi nui kia koutou. Dear Parents, Caregivers and friends of the school.



School Theme: During the Covid-19 pandemic, Pope Francis noticed the doctors, nurses, storekeepers, supermarket workers, cleaners, caregivers and transport workers, who often go unnoticed but sustain our life by their work and presence. This observation moved him to think about St Joseph and the way he expressed his fatherly love for Jesus. Pope Francis sees Joseph as the great example of hidden love and care, with the way he walked alongside Jesus, loving him tenderly and humbly.

We have adopted and embraced Pope Francis' insight, leading us to also recognise how we too can walk in the footsteps of Christ (modelled by the actions of St Joseph). This year our theme is "Walking in the footsteps of St Joseph; justly, tenderly, humbly" We will continue embracing our theme with the children and community over the final half of 2021.

School Wide Theme - Term 3:

This term our thematic unit is titled 'Food to Table'. The children and staff will be exploring this theme with a science focus and our 'Catholic Lens' will also integrate this theme with our current Religious Education focus of 'God - Te Atua'.

Thanks to everyone who supported our sports teams in Term Two and to those of you who are supporting our teams this term. Thanks also to the teachers who have co-ordinated our winter codes. This term we will be building up our running stamina before our cross country in Week 5.

Our Community Challenge:




CATHOLIC SCHOOLS' DAY
