

Our School Journey: Structured Literacy

Children learning to read need to make connections and develop pathways between these areas

ALL brains learn to read in the same way.

in the brain....

REGIONS OF THE BRAIN ASSOCIATED WITH READING Phonological Assembly (Parieto-Temporal Region) Connects letters to sounds **Orthographic Processor Phonological Processor** (Occipito-Temporal Region) (Inferior Frontal Gyrus) Stores information for Processes sounds automatic word recognition

The Complexity of the English Language....

There are **26 letters** in the alphabet.

There are **44 sounds** (phonemes).



There are over **250 spellings** of the sounds (graphemes).



Structured Literacy follows a 'Scope and Sequence' to teach these sounds in reading and writing.



"If a child memorises 10 words, the child can only read 10 words. But if a child learns 10 sounds, the child will be able to read 350 three sound words, 4 320 four sound words and 21 650 five sound words." - Martin Kozloff, 2002
